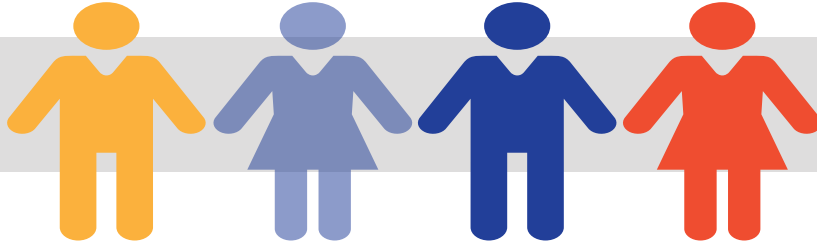


United Way of Central Massachusetts MAKES A DIFFERENCE IN OUR COMMUNITY
